After the Civil War, it was northern philanthropists who were helping to finance education in the South for the poor and the newly emancipated slaves and their children. Anna T. Jeanes' contribution created an invariable army of supervisory teachers who went into the rural, agricultural areas in Texas to train teachers. Fifteen southern states benefitted from Jeanes' support, with the most effort going to Texas.

Directions: From I-30 take Summit exit. Turn left (West) on 7th Street. Cross the bridge over Trinity River. Turn left (south) on Museum Way. Follow the street behind the Residence Inn.
