Kimberlie Gilliland is a Cherokee Nation citizen who currently lives in the capital of the Cherokee Nation. She is the founding executive director of the first 501(c)(3) to be incorporated under a tribe. She is an expert in crisis management and an award-winning media producer. She is currently overseeing the restoration, preservation, and revitalization of Bacone College's extensive art collection, as well as producing a documentary on the Bacone art style known as the Bacone School of Painting. Kimberlie holds dual degrees from University of California Berkeley in Chemistry and Biology, and a BS in Graphic Art from the Art Institute. She holds a master's in Nonprofit Business Administration.
