

CHOCOLATE PEANUT CANDY - Made in a Crockpot

Served at the 2014 Silent Auction, from the kitchen of June Hill

Ingredients:

2 - 16 oz jar lightly salted dry roasted peanuts

1 - 16 oz jar unsalted dry roasted peanuts

12 oz milk chocolate or semi-sweet chips (2 cups)

1 - 24 oz block white almond bark

1 - 4 oz pkg. German sweet chocolate

Layer in crockpot:

Peanuts Chocolate chips Almond bark broken/chopped in pieces German sweet chocolate broken/chopped in pieces

Cook on **LOW** 2 hours without stirring.

Stir and mix well until all peanuts are covered. Drop by teaspoon onto waxed or parchment paper and let cool until set. Store in air-tight container. Made 130 pieces for the auction.
