## MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL Begins March 16, 2017

It will soon be time for all of us to renew our membership in AAUW-TCB. Our vision is simple our mission is sound, and YOUR MEMBERSHIP makes our voice more powerful! Thank you for believing in the vital work of AAUW. Thank you for participating in interest groups. Thank you for volunteering to serve in so many ways. Thank you for enriching friendships with each gathering.



#### Since AAUW TCB is a 501(c)(3) Nonprofit, our dues paid are tax deductible as follows:

- **Regular Members:** \$62.00 total tax deductible, based on National dues of \$49.00 (less \$3 not tax deductible) = \$46.00 national + \$16 local = \$62.00.
- Life Members (paid up National) dues: \$16, local branch dues, is tax deductible.
- The State of Texas AAUW Affiliate is in the process of applying for 501(c)(3) Nonprofit status, and we will keep you updated on their progress. Currently the \$13 State portion of our dues is not tax deductible. (In case you missed it, our State dues increased \$3 for 2017-2018.)
- **AAUW National Student Affiliate fee is \$17:** \$16 is tax deductible, and \$1 is not tax deductible.
- **Bottom line for Regular Members:** \$49.00 national + \$13.00 state + \$16.00 local = **\$78.00**, of which **\$62.00 is tax deductible.**

You can renew your membership with Tarrant County Branch online, starting March 16, with a credit card through the national website of AAUW. This online service is called Membership Payment Program (MPP). The process is simple. You will need your member ID number, which you will find under your

name in the AAUW-TCB yearbook. If you are a new member, call Orlew at 817-715-1192 and she will give you your ID #.

With ID number & credit card in hand, follow these steps:

- 1. Google <u>www.aauw.org/</u>
- 2. Click on Membership
- 3. Under Branch Members, Click on Renew
- 4. Under Join & Renew online, click on Log into the MSD now
- 5. Click on Enter Member Services Database
- 6. Review your contact information and submit changes if any
- 7. On left of screen click on Renew My Membership
- 8. Fill in the blanks, and submit

*Voilà!* Your renewed membership is valid until June 30, 2018.

Though payment through the MPP is preferred, you may still pay your membership renewal by check. Make your check payable to AAUW-TCB in the amount of \$78.00, and send it to Peggy Hendon. 






When a 14-year-old girl is the alleged victim of a terrible act of racial violence, the incident shocks and galvanizes her community, exacerbating the racial tension that has been simmering in this New Jersey town for decades. Unfolding in a succession of multiracial voices, in a community transfixed by this alleged crime and the spectacle unfolding around it, this profound novel exposes what — and who — the "sacrifice" actually is and what consequences these events hold for us all. Oates offers a sympathetic portrait of the young girl and her mother and challenges our expectations and beliefs about our society, our biases, and ourselves. As the chorus of its voices from the police to the media to the victim and her family — reaches a crescendo, The Sacrifice offers a shocking new understanding of power and oppression, innocence and quilt, truth and sensationalism, justice and retribution.
