Our branch was well represented at the 19th Annual Victory Over Violence Walk on April 11th, benefitting The Women's Center. Three hundred volunteers helped in the weeks leading up to and on race day, including our AAUW Community Service group. There were a record 3750 participants this year on a cool, cloudy morning. On hundred seventeen teams showed their support in the Run/Walk, and 169 signs of support were posted. It was a perfect morning to get some exercise while supporting the mission and programs of The Women's Center.


