

TARRANT COUNTY COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP NEWS

Great strides have been made by our branch, exceeding our goals! With the tremendous efforts of our branch's fundraising and the branch's endowment we will now fully support last year's returning recipient and three new awardees. The four scholarships are for the 2015-2016 academic year at Tarrant Community College.
