College women mentors from TCC and TCU will lead small group sessions. Themes this year include positive body image, treating others with respect, and reaching educational goals.



Here's how you can help:

- * Contact our Logistics person Orlew Lauger to volunteer for all or part of the day Nov 14th!
 - No training is required and it's lots of fun!
 - First sign up with <u>Orlew Lauger</u>, our volunteer coordinator, so you will receive the parking pass and instructions for where to go at the TCC Trinity River Campus.
 - Let Orlew know what hours you can work, part of the day or all day.
 - More help is needed in the 8 am to 12:30 pm timeframe, but some help is needed all day long.

- At 8 am, tables have to be organized, T-shirts sized and distributed, folders completed and distributed, students registered, and food served for breakfast.
- While the girls are out in small groups, our volunteers will assemble the Goodie Bags.
- We also serve the girls lunch at noon.
- We will give Goodie Bags to the mentors and the middle school girls.

* Help supply items for the Goodie Bags we send home with the students and mentors!

- Anything that college women or middle school girls might like.
- Request <u>free</u> items from a local merchant or business you frequent.
- Purchase items from the Dollar Store, Target or other similar store.
- The quantity can be 1 or 100. All items will be used.
