Phenomenal Women and Fundraising

Phenomenal Women: A Series of Experiences Beginning March 24

New this spring, this interest group will create a series of monthly “phenomenal experiences” for learning, empowerment, pleasure, entertainment, and/or community. **We offer these experiences for AAUW members and their guests.** This is not for self-promotion or promoting a business, but rather for sharing our knowledge and passions.

Each “phenomenal” experience will be a donation from the branch member who organizes the event. Any materials needed for the experience will be provided, as well as light refreshments, if appropriate. The creator will offer the event at home or at an appropriate venue and make all the arrangements.

Each event will provide an engaging experience and the creator will set a suggested minimum donation for attendees (\$10, 15, 20). **This provides the additional benefit of fundraising for our branch.** Sign-up will be taken online and at Branch meetings. Most events will be scheduled on a Saturday morning or afternoon and run for two hours.

Event # 1 – Birding 101

A fun beginner bird walk is offered to members and their guests on Saturday, March 24th. We will look for and hopefully view ducks, shorebirds, songbirds and raptors while leisurely walking the trail alongside the Trinity River. Tips for finding and identifying birds will be shared. The morning is the best time for seeing the birds, so we will plan to be on the trail by 8:30 AM. The meeting place will be the Starbucks at Trinity Commons, 3000 S Hulen St, #143, FW 76109. For optional coffee, come earlier at 8 AM. We will depart by carpool at 8:30 to drive the very short distance and park on Bellaire Dr South near the bridge. We will walk along the paved FW Trinity Trails by the river, for approximately 1 ½ hours. Dress for the weather (it is usually slightly cooler along the river) and wear comfortable

walking shoes. Bring binoculars, remember sunscreen and a sunhat. There will be extra binoculars available for anyone needing them. Those interested may join in a Dutch treat après birding brunch/lunch afterwards.

- **Life Members (paid up National) dues: \$29.00** = \$13.00 state + \$16.00 local, of which **\$16.00 is tax deductible.**
- **AAUW National Student Affiliate dues: \$18.81**, of which **\$16.81 is tax deductible.**

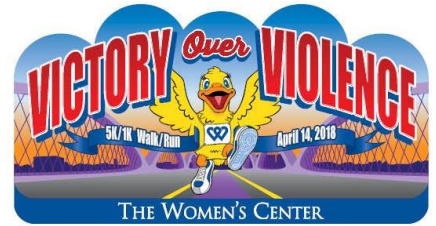

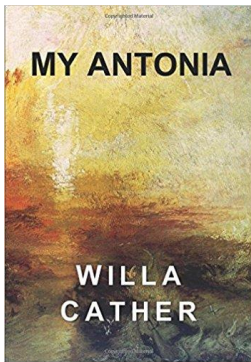

My Antonia is a novel published in 1918 by American writer Willa Cather, considered one of her best works. It is the final book of her "prairie trilogy" of novels, preceded by ***O Pioneers!*** and ***The Song of the Lark***. The novel tells the stories of an orphaned boy from Virginia, Jim Burden, and the elder daughter in a family of Bohemian immigrants, Antonia Shimerda, who are each brought as children to be pioneers in Nebraska towards the end of the 19th century. Both the pioneers who first

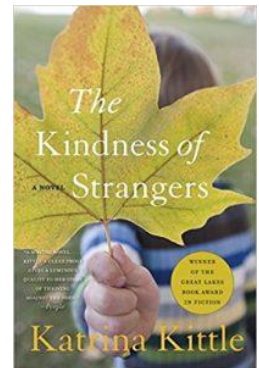

April is Sexual Assault Awareness Month

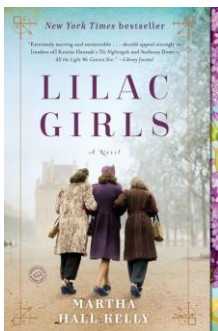

Thoughts at the End – This year the **Universal Declaration of Human Rights** (UDHR) turns 70. The declaration's 26th article proclaims that everyone has the right to education, regardless of sex. The document states that fundamental education for women and girls is not a *privilege*. It is a *right* that must be distributed equally and upon merit. This clause has been a guiding principle at AAUW through our [legislative advocacy](#), [campus initiatives](#), and [fellowships and grants](#), in which \$3.7M is awarded annually to advance educational opportunities for women and girls worldwide.
