Sister to Sister Summit, October 19



The 19th Sister to Sister Summit was a winner! We had 128 middle school girls from seven FWISD and one Castleberry ISD school (this was their first time to attend), a large increase over the 84 girls last year. All the girls had a good time as they learned to interact with students from other schools and were mentored by college women.

Cecilia Silva and Elda Rodriguez recruited and trained 40 TCU, TCC and Tarleton State college students to lead the girls in three chat sessions for this year's program, "The Power of One". It was inspiring to see so many returning college mentors.

Our 20 super AAUW volunteers were recruited by Tricia Deitz and did everything from preparing the facilitator bags to welcoming the girls, helping with breakfast and lunch, filling the gift bags, monitoring the hallways, taking photographs and cleaning up.

Once again, we had the good fortune to be hosted by the very accommodating TCC Northwest Campus. TCC provided a wonderful breakfast and lunch for everyone, supplied a string backpack with several TCC gifts inside to all the middle school girls, and supported us with helpful staff at the event. We are indebted to Becki Griffith, the many departments who coordinated all the arrangements, and the President of the Northwest Campus who gave our keynote address. Mary DuBoise and Barbara Cager were our liaisons with the school systems and their counselors and made sure we had school buses lined up, brochures and flyers distributed, t-shirts purchased, and registration smoothly handled. Surely a job that requires patience and perseverance.

Thank you to all our expert shoppers, including BJ Hoskins, who was responsible for all the gift items for the girls and facilitators; Jane Parris, who purchased the gift for the keynote speaker and the books for the school counselors and made beautiful gift bags for all of these plus the door prizes; and Phyllis Goodman and Margaret Duryee, who purchased all the necessary supplies so that the chat sessions ran smoothly. Thank you to Orlew Lauger, Past Chair of the Purchasing Committee, a guiding light for our new committee members.

This AAUW program benefited from generous donations by our members to the gift bags, as well as a sizable donation from Half Price Books, enabling us to give each girl two books.
