Update on Our Tarrant County College Scholarship Recipients

What an unexpected academic world our TCC scholars entered this spring semester!

Classrooms were closed and Emily Harding, Jazmine Lumbrera and Amber Patrick suddenly entered the world of online classes. AAUW TCB Scholarships are a lifeline for these students to continue their academic goals. With the loss of part time work and the charge of children at home due to COVID-19, their lives have been complicated beyond their wildest expectations. In April 2020, it was reported that all scholarship recipients were still enrolled in their classes. We are so proud of their efforts and stamina to continue their studies in the present environment.

With the current economic upheaval, we are grateful to the **TCC Foundation** for their careful stewardship of our scholarship funds. Our current endowment is \$76,742.00. Our distribution for scholarships is based on a 3-year rolling average which includes the highs from the past 2 years as well as the low of this past quarter. Thankfully, the highs of the stock market will offset the current lows. Also, a note of thanks to past treasurers, **Peggy Hendon** and **Becki Griffith**, for maintaining our cash reserve of \$5,893.00 for emergency shortfalls.

We were genuinely moved by our current board's decision to opt out of the special May **North Texas Giving Day** so that nonprofits directly impacted by this pandemic might reap funds to serve needs of North Texas. With that being said, we will be counting on our members more than ever during the September **North Texas Giving Day**. We will need the support of every member to sponsor our three scholarships, more relevant than ever in these times.

BJ and I are grateful for members' enthusiastic support of the AAUW Tarrant County Branch TCC Scholarships, making it a successful community program.
